We the People of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union, insure domestic Tranquillity, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

Article I

Section. 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section. 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section. 3. The Senate shall be composed of Senators chosen every second Year by the States, two from each State. Immediately after the Expiration of the first Term of the Senators of the first Class, one third shall be chosen at the Expiration of the second Term, and one third at the Expiration of the third Term, so that one third may be chosen every second Year; and if Vacancies happen, they shall be filled in the Manner prescribed in this Article for the Election of Senators. No Person shall be a Senator who shall not, when elected, be an Inhabitant seven Years of the United States, who shall not, when elected, be thirty Years of Age, who shall not, when elected, be a Citizen of the United States, and who shall not, when elected, be chosen from one of the States.

Section. 4. The House of Representatives shall choose their Speaker and other Officers; and shall have the sole Power of Impeachment. The Senate shall have the sole Power to try all Impeachments. When sitting for that Purpose, they shall be on Oath or Affirmation. The President shall be tried by the Chief Justice. IN REMEMBRANCE



JOHN J. O'CONNOR, Jr.
1930-1987

The class of 1977 dedicated Lytae to Professor O'Connor, who was then serving as the acting Dean. They were troubled times. The divisions in the faculty were deep; the confidence of the legal community in the Law School had waned. Dean O'Connor's steady hand and calming influence brought the Law School through those dark days of despair. In that transition period, when the school might well have foundered, he provided the necessary leadership and guiding spirit.

Professor O'Connor's impact on our Law School must largely be measured by his classroom performance. He was preeminently a teacher. For many of us, he was the first to call us "counselor." He was the first to question us intensely on a point of law. He was the first to make us think. But Professor O'Connor mollified his insistence on precise legal analysis with the recognition that, after all, we are neophytes of the law. The Lytae dedication in 1977 captured this point: "He has tempered his driving nature to get us to learn with a sharp and quick sense of humor. He has tried to keep our spirits high at times when all seemed lost. He has reached out to us with more than his intellect; he has reached out with his heart."

Professor O'Connor was also a very religious per-

son. Perhaps his sense of justice derived from that tradition. To him, law was not self-centered; it summoned us to the higher calling of service to others. For Professor O'Connor, the legal and religious traditions converged in a prayer of Saint Francis of Assisi. As acting dean, he offered the prayer as guidance for the Class of 1977. It read in part: "Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love; for it is in giving that we receive."

Finally, there was a gnawing suspicion that Professor O'Connor was a leprechaun in a prior life. His twinkling eyes and mischievous ways revealed to the close observer the spirit of some transplanted creature from the old sod. When the vending machines would swallow our money without disgorging our food, when the library was too hot in the summer and too cold in the winter, and when the word processing system listed corned beef and cabbage on its menu, one somehow suspected that happenstance was not the explanation. But if, by chance, you caught Professor O'Connor acting as a leprechaun, he would disclose only the treasure of spirited dedication to law and humanity. For that he shall forever be remembered.
